CHECK-IN / CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

NOTE: PLEASE TEXT VICKI (321) 258-8712 UPON ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Texting Vicki upon arrival, provides Vicki peace of mind knowing that you in the property and all is well.

It is equally important to text her when you leave the unit. We have busy vacation rentals and there's probably another guest wanting to get in as soon as possible. Ideally, Vicki needs 4 hours to properly clean and prepare the property for the next guest.

NOTE: Vicki works from 8AM to 6PM - so unless emergency please try to keep to those hours for communications...

CHECK-IN PROCEEDURE

- Please look around and make sure everything is satisfactory.
- After your have reviewed the condo, please TEXT Vicki **(321) 258-8712** that you have arrived and advise of any issue or ask any questions you may have, etc...

CHECK-OUT PROCEEDURE

- Please take a load of trash to the dumpster
- Please place recycling in recycling bins behind dumpster
- Dishes: Please place dirty dishes in dishwasher and start dishwasher
- Laundry: Please start a load of like color linens OR towels
- Turn off light
- Please turn A/C to 74 degrees
- TEXT Vicki **(321) 258-8712** when you depart
- Lock front door behind you.

Note: seems obvious - but walk outside, close door behind you and press the lock icon on the lower left side of the keypad.

POLICIES

Guests: Maximum number of guests - able sleep in this unit - is 4

Pets: Only owners are allowed to have pets at Spanish Main.

Parking:

- Hang pass from your vehicle rear view mirror or place on the dash.
- No trailers or RV's.
- Overflow parking, used during peak times, can be found on the grass near the complex entrance.

RULES

Smoking:

- There is no smoking allowed in the unit.
- If you do smoke, please do so on the balcony. Please dispose of your butts by extinguishing them and then placing in the trash - ensuring that they are cool and do not start a fire.
- Please do not flick butts from balcony onto the sand dunes.
- Also, please do not flick butts on the beach in general. It is littering. When in town my wife and I walk the beach picking up trash. **Help us - help the environment.**

Pool (center of condo complex) Rules:

- Hours 9AM till dusk
- Food and drink are NOT allowed by the pool (in accordance with Florida law)
- Sound travels so please try to keep it to a dull roar ;-)

Quiet Time:

- 10PM till 8AM
- Limit behavior - at any time - which would affect occupants in another unit.

Windows & Doors:

Please keep doors and windows shut.

We know, you came to the beach for the breeze and the sound. However...

1. Leaving the doors and windows open can freeze the A/C.. If it freezes due to a door or window being left open you will be without A/C until we can get a service company out to fix it - and you will be responsible for the cost.
2. Sea air is good for your bronchial system - but bad for electrical and mechanical systems in the unit.

Note: Slider and windows are hurricane rated

BEACH RULES

MOST IMPORTANT: NO GLASS ON THE BEACH!!

We often times see beach-goers get their beer confiscated, not because it's alcohol (which is allowed), but because it is glass. It can be a costly mistake so please note.

- No Fires (fires are only allowed on the beach with a permit).
- No Fireworks on the beach.
- Do not dig holes in the sand (for the safety of people walking at night)
- No camping.
- Leave only your footprints - leave no trash or cigarette butts on the beach.
- No flashlights - between May 1 and October 31

SEA TURTLES - AND ORDINANCES

Sea Turtle nesting ordinance May 1 through October 31

- If you are visiting between the above dates you are required to shade ALL light from the beach between 9PM and 5AM
- This means our guests should draw the blinds in the MASTER BEDROOM and LIVING room so the sea turtles don't get lured to your lights - rather than the moon reflecting off of the ocean.
- FINES: If the above rules are not followed our Condo Association could be penalized with some stiff fines.
- More importantly - you could put turtles in peril by misguiding them.

Note: This is why our complex is dimly lit with orange (turtle approved) lighting

More about Sea Turtles:

- Turtles are a super cute endanger species. If you see one - give it a wide berth!
- Do not use a flashlights or phone light or camera flash at night on the beach (Of course, your safety obviously comes first).
- Do not mess with their nests! (you will often see their nests outlined with orange / yellow tape)
- More likely than seeing a turtle, you will see their tracks - coming and going from the surf.

HOW TO

Front Door Keypad:

- **Keys:** Now you know your door code is the last four digits of the phone number you supplied.
- **Keypad:** To use the keypad (from outside the unit), press anywhere on the touch pad - to light the digits - and enter your code. To lock the door, from outside, simply close the door and touch the lock icon on the lower right hand side of the keypad. It will lock the deadbolt automatically.
- **Safety:** In general, there is very little crime in Cocoa Beach. That being said we recommend locking doors at night and using common sense.

Wi-Fi:

Look for SSID: Spanish Main_Guest

NOTE: There is no password. A web page will pop up and you will have to agree to the terms. Simply agree and start using.

TV OPERATION:

- **TO TURN THE TV ON AND OFF:**
 - USE THE SMALL (ROKU) REMOTE AND PRESS THE RED BUTTON.
- **TO WATCH LIVE TV:**
 - PRESS THE ON BUTTON ON THE CABLE BOX BELOW EACH TV
 - USE SMALL (ROKU) REMOTE TO TOGGLE UP AND OVER TO THE SQUARE THAT SAYS...
 - **LIVING ROOM = ROKU AND PRESS THE "OK" BUTTON**
 - **BEDROOM = CABLE TV AND PRESS THE "OK" BUTTON**
 - THEN USE THE LARGE SPECTRUM REMOTE TO GO UP AND DOWN THE CHANNELS OR USE THE GUIDE BUTTON, ETC...
 - DO NOT USE THE SPECTRUM REMOTE TO TURN TV ON AND OFF.
- **TO WATCH FREE NETFLIX:**
 - USE THE SMALL ROKU REMOTE TO TOGGLE TO THE NETFLIX BOX - AND START WATCHING
 - SELECT IT ON THE SCREEN OR ON THE REMOTE.
- **NOTE:** The remotes need to have line of site to the TV in order to work.

TV PROGRAMING:

- We offer a premium spectrum TV package (silver package) (Free HBO, Cinemax, ESPN, History Channel, USA, Showtime, etc.)
- We also offer **free Netflix and Pandora** (for listening to music)
- Also, you can use your own login for such channels as Amazon & Hulu. (If you do this, please be sure to delete your passwords!)
- All TV's in the condo should have the same programming.

Music:

- **Via the TV:** Go to the Pandora app on the TV. YouTube is also fun interactive way to listen to music (tip: search for Carpool Karaoke)
- **Bluetooth Speaker:** There should be a small bluetooth speaker in the unit. You can connect it to your mobile device.

Air Conditioning:

- **Special Note:** Please do not keep the balcony door open - especially when the A/C unit is on. It will freeze the unit and it will break. You will then be without A/C until it gets fixed - and be responsible for the cost.
- In the experience of the owners - a comfortable temperature is 73, which is contrary to when they are back in Texas where they prefer a slightly lower temperature.
- The point being, if you lower the temperature you will make the A/C system work harder (make more noise) without accomplishing much.

Phone:

- **Cell phones:** The reception in the condo is not great. Therefore, we have a phone for our guests to use (Unit 16 only).
- **Free home phone:** Domestic calls and calls to Canada are free :-)
- **The condo phone number is: (321) 613-0695 (again, only unit 16)**

Washer / Dryer:

- **Washing machine:** We are having a small issue with our washing machine. Please do loads on the **QUICK WASH OR SPEED WASH** setting, and a low or medium spin. Note: Light loads at high spin rate will make this machine take off ;-)
- **Dryer:** Guest should try drying like materials, together. For instance if you put in fast wicking sportswear with hard to dry towels - the dryer might sense the clothes are dry even though the towels are still wet or damp.
- **Detergent:** There is always extra detergent - help yourself.

Kitchen:

- **Ice (unit 16):** Make sure the ice maker is on - by swinging the chrome wire stopper into the *down* position.
- **COFFEE:** We provide a regular drip coffee maker. We also provide a Keurig.
- Starter packets for both will be provided
- Also, a few creamers / sweeteners, etc...
- If there is any unopened food in the pantry - feel free to use it!

Charcoal Grills:

- There are two charcoal grills down near the beach entrance
- You will need to bring your own charcoal / starter / matches, etc...
- The quickest / easiest place to get these supplies is probably the Dollar General (which is exactly due west from the condo - behind ABC Liquor)

Beach Gear and Access:

- **Beach Gear:** Beach chairs and an umbrella in unit are on the balcony. If you can't find what you need - text Vicki @ **(321) 258-8712**.
- **Beach Towels:** Can be found in the master bath cabinet
- **Beach Access:** No key needed. The walkway is located in the center of the complex. It should be obvious.
- **SANDY TOWELS:** SHAKE ALL BEACH TOWELS OF SAND BEFORE HEADING UP TO THE UNIT - AND ESPECIALLY BEFORE WASHING / DRYING.
- **SANDY BEACH GEAR:** PLEASE WASH OFF ANY EACH STUFF BEFORE HEADING UP TO THE UNIT. THERE IS A HOSE AT THE BEACH ENTRANCE.
- **SANDY SHOES:** YOU WILL BE HAPPIER IF THE UNIT IS NOT FILLED WITH SAND - SO YOU SHOULD GET THE SAND OFF YOUR SHOES BEFORE ENTERING THE UNIT.

Beach / Pool Towels:

- We supply beach / pool towels. They will be in the master bath cabinet.

Neighbors:

- Be courteous and please be aware that people are staying below you.

Departure:

- **Please turn the Air Conditioner to 74**
- **Please leave Vicki** a note with any issues involving cleaning, maintenance, etc... (If we will need to call a service repair company, please let Vicki know if and when the issue occurs)
- **Please place dirty dishes in dishwasher - and turn it on**
- **Cleaning:** Cleaning is included - but please don't leave the unit a mess.
- **It would be helpful to bring one (or more) bags of garbage / recycling down to the dumpster area**

Recycling Note: When recycling - empty contents of plastic bag into a recycling bin and then throw the plastic bag away. The plastic bags are not recyclable :-)

- **Ron Jon local weather report:** Call 321-799-8888 ext 7

Getting Around

Orlando International Airport:

- TSA-Pre is a LOT easier to get through security.
- Make sure you are careful about getting on the correct tram to your gate. If you get on the wrong one - you will have to go back through security.
- There is an ok Ruby Tuesday's near the American Airlines gate.
- AA Admirals Club; if you fly American, there is now an admirals club located near the gates for their domestic flights.

UBER / LYFT:

- Uber is great for getting around Cocoa Beach. It is also good to/from Orlando International

NOTE: it is about \$85 (tip not included) each way from our condo Cocoa Beach

Geography Overview

Note: You are visiting the Space Coast - which is mostly in Brevard County.



Kennedy Space Center (KSC): This is the infamous site of NASA and where SpaceX (Musk) now launches their rockets. Blue Origin (Bezos) is now building their rockets up at the Cape - in some impressive new buildings. If you are thinking of visiting KSC, we have a special section for you to read toward the end of this binder.

Fun Fact: One reason rockets are launched in Florida has to do with the Earth's rotation. The Earth rotates most quickly at the equator, and to take advantage of this, in addition to the orbital velocity of the rocket, it is most beneficial to launch from a southerly location (near the equator).

Port Canaveral: Is mainly known for where the cruise ships come and go from. It is also home to a dozen or so restaurants on the south side. Our favorite restaurant being Seafood Atlantic. It only provides casual al fresco dining and is also a seafood store. If weather and sun shade permit, try to sit nearest to the water. You might just see a dolphin up close ;-)

Cape Canaveral: Is often confused with Kennedy Space Center. However, it really is a town, two square miles in size, between the "The Port" and Cocoa Beach. In our opinion, there is not much to see or do there unless you are on a tour of some kind.

Geography Overview (Continued)

Cocoa Beach is made up of three areas.

1. **North Cocoa Beach:** Home to the famous Ron Jon's surf shop. It's fun for an outing. It is also home to the Cocoa Beach Pier. It was recently bought by the Siegel's. You might know them from the TV show, *The Queen of Versailles*. The point being, it is slowly being renovated. Fun for a visit - but your trip will be complete if you happen to miss it ;-). North Cocoa Beach is also home to the Publix where we recommend you do your grocery shopping.
2. **Downtown Cocoa Beach (where you are staying):** Is a rejuvenating small area with a growing number of restaurants, shops, art stores, music, festivals, etc...
3. **South Cocoa Beach:** Home to residences and quiet beach life.

Points south:

South of "South Cocoa Beach" is Patrick Air Force Base: An interesting drive by - but unless you are military it is off limits.

Once you pass Patrick AFB you will enter other beach areas / towns. Satellite Beach, Indialantic and Melbourne Beach. Unless you are up for a road trip (or need a Lowe's hardware store) there is probably not much of a reason to go south of Patrick AFB since it is mainly condo's lining the beach side of A1A - and little to no view of the beach or ocean.

THINGS TO DO:

We make a good effort to inform our guests of things to do - but we have not done and seen everything.

If you are more adventurous (and we hope you are!!) we recommend "Googling" such things as "Trip Advisor Cocoa Beach" for activities that will meet your groups desires.

There are boat and fishing tours up at the Cape, adventure sports, wildlife tours, 27 hole golf course - and of course miniature golf. Kennedy Space Center is almost exactly 30 minutes. Orlando is an easy hour drive.

Then again, there is a great pool and a wide open beach right out your door!

When we are in town (Dave and Stacy) we get out and about - but also have a routine...

- Watch the world come alive (pre-dawn) while sipping coffee and catching up
- Walking before the sun gets too high in the sky
- Seafood lunch ;-)
- Relaxing on the balcony at sunset
- Walking to dinner downtown (when not cooking in...)

Note:

1. The sunrise, here, really happens before the sun creeps above the horizon!!
2. It is best to walk on the beach when it is not "High Tide". Google or Siri can inform you of that...
3. This may be obvious, but if you are looking for beach time, look no further than the beach in front of our condo. It is one of the least busy segments of beach.

However, if you are looking for some more people, food and drink - simply walk south a 1/2 mile (or drive) down to Coconuts on the Beach.

THINGS TO DO (Continued)

Rocket Launches:

Of course, rocket launches are a must if you are lucky enough to be in town. You can see Cape Canaveral's launch pads by looking to the North from our balcony. Therefore, you can see launches from the balcony. However, to get the full affect, you should walk down to the beach :-). You can see the schedule at www.kennedyspacecenter.com/launches-and-events

- However, many places and many schedules - so let your fingers do the walking. However, for jazz, Heidi's Jazz Club is a must.

Comedy Club:

Pretty fun for a sleepy little beach town! They get some great acts. Check the schedule! NOTE: Comedy at Gregory's is for adults only and may contain explicit language and graphic discussions of an adult nature. It is located above Gregory's Restaurant - and walking distance from the condo.

Gambling Cruise:

We have not been on it - but hear it can be fun - given the right mindset ;-). For information, visit victorycasinocruises.com

Restaurants:

Finer Dining: Nice shorts, collared shirt and decent sandals are ok...

- **Fat Kahuna\$\$\$:** Walkable from the condo. Great thoughtful dishes. Right downtown near Coconuts on the Beach. There is very limited seating in this restaurant. Reservations are a must - UNLESS you find an open table outside or seats at the bar. For either of these (outside or bar) you do not need to have a reservation! Note: They do not do Opentable. To book - you need to them at (321) 783-6858. Leave a msg - they do call back. www.fatkahunas.com
- **Fat Snook \$\$\$:** This is one of the best restaurants, most expensive - and most upscale restaurant in Cocoa Beach. In fact, it is in South Cocoa Beach - so transport will be required. Still, smart casual beach attire (nice shorts OK). Reservations required: 321-784-1190 www.thefatsnook.com
- **Gregory's \$\$\$:** An old school good restaurant. Reservations recommended. Note: The Comedy Club is located upstairs. Makes for a fun date night. (321) 799-2557 www.gregorysonthebeach.com
- **Flavor Kitchen and Wine Bar \$\$\$:** A great addition to downtown Cocoa Beach! If you can, ask to sit at the chefs table. It is for two - but if you ask nicely they can squeeze a third in. It is really not a table - but bar seats overlooking the chef's station. Jason, the chef, owner and "entertainer" (be warned, there will be some swearing ;-)) and good food. www.flavourkitchencb.com
- **Luna Food and Wine \$\$\$:** We were here on the first night it opened. Admittedly they didn't have their act together so the experience was a little jaded. However I know the chef to be top notch and it should be good! www.lunafoodandwine.com
- **Florida Fresh Grill \$\$:** Busy, centrally located restaurant in the public strip mall area. They don't take reservations but you can call ahead for seating (321) 613-5649 www.floridasfreshgrill.com
- **Pompano Grill \$\$:** This used to be a favorite - but have not been there in a while. It is a funny little place that used to at least) serve very classy meals, reasonable prices and good service. Tablecloths and cloth napkins. Reservations are recommended. 321.784.9005 www.PompanoGrill.com
- **Jazzys Mainely Lobster-Seafood\$\$:** This used to be more of a seafood store. They have recently opened a "jazzy" restaurant with bar. We have not tried it yet - but it looks really inviting. Another great addition to the neighborhood! www.jazzysmainelylobster.com

Casual Dining:

- **Seafood Atlantic:** Great seafood in casual OUTDOOR dining on the cruise ship canal in Cape Canaveral. (we really like the "red" shrimp. However, it's all good. (10 minute drive) seafoodatlantic.org
- **Coconuts on the Beach:** This is arguably the most touristy place in town. It provides mainly al fresco dining (and drinking) and is very casual. However, it serves up some GREAT food. French fries are super, as are the blackened shrimp with grits. However, our favorite thing is the bacon wrapped scallops. Who would have thought bar food could be so good. No reservations needed. coconutsonthebeach.com / (321) 784-1422
- **4th Street Filling Station:** Very walk-able, hip, relaxing and casual place. Just south of ABC Liquor. A newer kind of dining / drinking establishment. A welcomed addition to our neighborhood!! www.4thstreetfillinstation.com/
- **Tiny Turtle:** A friend told us about this place that serves up good Caribbean flair food. He recommends the Sofrito Bowl. Order multiple sides of salsa if you like salsa (small portions). Downtown Cocoa Beach: www.thetinyturtle.com
- **Yen Yen Chinese Restaurant:** Right in Downtown. Walkable. Never eaten here - but hear the food is good.
- **New China:** \$ We got delivery from here and it was pretty good and prices reasonable. It is in the Publix parking lot and next to the Florida Fresh Grill. www.newchinacocoabeach.com
- **Anacapari:** (just north of ABC Liquor) Good Pizza and Italian food.
- **Brunos:** Great, reasonably priced pizza - half block south of ABC Liquor. They will deliver to this condo :-). They have thin crust - and in fact all their pizza' to order. www.cocoabeach-brunos-pizzeria.menufy.com
- **Siam Orchid:** Awesome sushi - and great service. It is very unassuming place. However, we like good sushi - and every time we visit we are surprised how good it is! Always good service. 1/4 mile north of ABC Liquor.
- **Grills Seafood Deck & Tiki Bar:** The food here is great and they often times have live music (call them for times, etc...) They have one in Port Canaveral and one south (on the Indian River in Melbourne) There are water views in either location. Sitting outside is preferred in either. www.grillsseafood.com
- **Rock the Guac:** If you need a mexican food fix, this is a good simple quick place just north of Ron Jons Surf Shop. www.rocktheguac.com

Tips for visiting Kennedy Space Center (KSC)

There are several different packages / costs when visiting KSC.

However, if you just want to get on property, see some old rockets, visit the souvenir store - and see some other cool things - then we have a deal for you!

So, the story goes...

... when we last showed up at KSC it was the middle of the week - and drizzling. Somehow, my wife talked the ticket agent down from \$50 to \$32 per person. With a little more digging we found out that there is a little known "gift shop only admission" deal. It allows you access to the main visitor grounds - and the gift shop - for a max of 90 minutes.

The kicker is, to get to the gift-shop, you will walk by all the real life rockets and other outdoor displays. You will simply not have access to the indoor displays and shows and exhibits.

HERE'S THE KSC DEAL :-)

- Buy the "gift shop admission ticket" for \$10 per person (DON'T LOOSE THEM).
- Enjoy the round and sights
- There are also food / snack vendors you can visit
- Go to the gift shop and buy "anything" (I think only one person in your group needs to buy "something" ;-)
- 90 minutes later - go to the Information Center and show proof of purchase (in our case they saw that we had a "bag" from the gift shop and that was proof enough.)
- Get your full refund (\$10 per person :-).
- Walk to car
- High five each other

Note: The Information Center, is located just outside of the ticket / security area.
